1. Occupation: Merchant tailor
Elected 20 Oct. 1618 Alderman of London and was Sheriff of London

2. Also know as "William of America". Came to the Colonies in 1688, Occupation: Merchant

3. William's second wife

4. Sent to Montgomery Co. NC.
Kept allegiance to the King and would not fight for Colonies... lost property (confiscated)

5. Wythe Co. VA is now called Bland Co. Settled on "Walker's Creek"
5b. Jerry II's death certificate says he was born in Carter Co. (assumed to be TN)

6. Military Service: 17 December 1863 - 24 July 1865, Civil War Vet. Co. F, 6th Reg. Indiana Volunteer Cavalry.

7. Sam Whitehead and Sussannah married when Theodosia was 5 years. Sam adopted Theodosia thus the Whitehead last name.

8. notes on web say one of Theodosia's parents was a Cherokee... maybe Sussannah. Sussannah was buried in Oklahoma.
Other children (with Sam) are also buried in OK: Mary Ann in Yarnby, Ok, Celia Elizabeth in Pottawatomie Co., OK
no mention of location of other children's burial

9. A William Hern is listed in the 1800 Sommerset Maryland census but not Thomas

10. Birth dates for Susan: a. Grave stone: December 19, 1833.
b. Amy Robison Brown (ARB) lists March 1834 in computer printout and Dec 21 1834 in e-mail.
c. ARB states in a later e-mail that the Dec 21, 1834 is the correct date.
d. Birth and baptism records of Zion Evangelical Church, of Catawba, formally Lincoln Co. NC 1806-61 lists a daughter as Susanna Christena as being born 21 Dec 1834 and bapt 21 June 1835.
e. John Jarrett, 1850 Yancy County, NC Census enumerated Sept. 1850 lists Susannah as 15.
f. The 1900 Collin County, Texas Census lists Susan's birth date as December 1832.

11. Allison's Regiment, East Tennessee Militia
War of 1812-Battle of Horseshoe Bend, 1814

12. Perlie Cooper's wife (Vina). Born Oct. 7, 1876. Died Jan, 5, 1957

13. Ida V. (Hearon) Cooper says her grandfather Doug (Joel L. Boring) made a very good living selling moonshine during Prohibition.
He was able to purchase a very large farm. However he often had to "hide out" for long periods of time in the mountains to avoid capture.
